

Paula Konikoff Elected 2023 Al Vice President

Paula K. Konikoff, JD, MAI, AI-GRS, was elected 2023 Appraisal Institute vice president by its Board of Directors during the Board's Aug. 4-5 meeting in Las Vegas.

Konikoff's one-year term as vice president will begin Jan. 1, when she'll also serve for one year as chair of the Finance Committee. She'll serve as president-elect in 2024, president in 2025 and immediate past president in 2026.

Konikoff serves as vice chair of Region VII, is past chair of the Professional Standards and Guidance Committee, of which she was a member for many years, and is a member of the Body of Knowledge Committee. She received her MAI Designation in 1986 and became active in the American Institute of Real Estate Appraisers (an Al predecessor organization) as a member of her chapter's Admission Committee and as an instructor. She has served on the Standards Committee, the Ethics Committee, the Admissions Appeal Board, and her chapter's Board of Directors. Additionally, she was involved in the creation of the national Women's Initiative Committee in 2019 and was its first chair. She is the author of "Appraisers in Arbitration," a developer of online seminars, a member of the development team for the Al-GRS qualifying education and a reviewer of textbooks published by the Appraisal Institute and articles submitted to "The Appraisal Journal."

Konikoff has been recognized twice with the President's Award and once with the Y.T. and Louise Lee Lum Award.

VA Accepting Some Desktop, Exterior-only Appraisals

The Department of Veterans Affairs announced July 27 that it will allow desktop and exterior-only appraisals for some transactions in response to high demand for appraisal services and limited availability of appraisers in certain areas. Al BOD Adopts 45-Day Notice Items During August Meeting

The Appraisal Institute Board of Directors voted to adopt two 45-Day Notice items during its Aug. 4-5 meeting in Las Vegas. The 45-Day Notice items address removal of officers, directors, and committee members, and regional elections and voting. The Board also adopted the proposed Regional Election Policy as set forth in the Exposure Draft distributed to Designated Members, Candidates, Practicing Affiliates and Affiliates on June 20. The Board also:

 Directed to 45-Day Notice proposed amendments to Bylaws, Article IX, Part C, related to Board meeting attendance for the incoming Board of Director's International Member following their election until the beginning of service on the BOD.

- Directed the investigation of high-level recommendations outlined in the diversity, equity and inclusion Action Plan.
- Voted on changes to Board member service on national committees.
- Voted to amend the Instructor Policy to include classroom and synchronous instructor audits.
- Voted to amend the Education Network Manual to include updated content on synchronous/live stream education programs.
- Adopted the 2023 budget.
- Approved the transfer of funds from the Operating Fund to the Reserve Fund.
- Voted to fund the in-person attendance of the incoming International Member on the Board of Directors at the regular Board meeting following his or her election beginning in 2023.

The Board elected the following individuals to serve in committee roles:

- Strategic Planning Committee: Joshua D. Garretson, MAI, AI-GRS, AI-RRS.

House Passes 'Concerning' VA Appraisal Legislation

The House on Sept. 14 passed $\underline{\mathsf{HR}\ 7735}$, the Improving Access to the VA Home Loan Benefit Act of 2022, legislation that proposes to overhaul the Department of Veterans Affairs' appraisal requirements, including when an appraisal is necessary, how appraisals are conducted and who is eligible to conduct an appraisal.

The legislation also allows for desktop appraisals in some circumstances, but the VA has already <u>made that</u> policy change.

The Appraisal Institute opposes this legislation and its Senate counterpart, \underline{S} 4208, and believes that concerns about slow VA appraisal turnaround times is overblown. In a $\underline{\text{May 13 letter}}$ to the House Veterans' Affairs Committee, AI noted, "We believe the VA appraisal process is sound and deserves broad support by the mortgage and housing sectors. We believe there are ways in which the program can be enhanced – education and awareness on the AAPP program, being one."
