### Rural Area Appraisals: Freddie Mac Guidelines and Property Eligibility Requirements

Wednesday, May 10, 2023 7 CE hours AWA Community Room, 509 Centennial Blvd, Voorhees (Includes lunch) Instructor: R. Scott Hartman, SRA Appraising rural properties can be challenging. A lack of comparable sales, uniqueness of homes, time between sales, and an expansive geography are factors appraisers must consider. This often means more time, research, and justification to determine an acceptable value for a property. To make this task less daunting, Freddie Mac identified common pain points and misconceptions among appraisers and lenders regarding collateral guidelines for rural properties. With the Appraisal Institute, they have developed a comprehensive rural appraisal training for practicing residential appraisers. This 7-hour seminar addresses eligible and ineligible property qualifications; price ceiling limitations in rural markets; how urban development, farm productivity, and conversion to residential uses affect land prices; highest and best use problems in rural residential appraisals; how the Freddie Mac Appraisal Guidelines relate to rural appraisals; how to extract and support adjustments in rural residential appraisals; how to support deductions for unusual designs or functional problems; and how to use regression analysis to support a conclusion regarding highest and best use. ### **FHA Publishes Updates**

On January 18, the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) published its latest version of the *Single Family Housing Policy Handbook* 4000.1 (<u>Handbook 4000.1</u>). This update includes enhancements and revisions to existing guidelines and various technical edits. In many cases, this newly added language augments and enhances existing policy. The updates also consider feedback received from industry stakeholders.

Update 13 includes language to clarify instruction, adds new guidance and information in Sections I, II, III, and IV and Appendix 3.0., and incorporates previously published Mortgagee Letters (MLs).

Handbook 4000.1 updates are effective as follows:

 The Handbook 4000.1 Transmittal reflects the addition of specific ML guidance, which is effective as previously announced in the corresponding ML.

- Changes identified in Section II.A of Handbook 4000.1 may be implemented immediately but must be implemented for mortgages with case numbers assigned on or after April 18, 2023
- All other changes may be implemented immediately but no later than April 18, 2023.

Stakeholders are encouraged to review the changes outlined in the Handbook 4000.1 Transmittal. Additionally, a separate redline version of Handbook 4000.1 has been posted on the <a href="Handbook 4000.1">Handbook 4000.1</a> information <a href="Page">Page</a>. The online version of Handbook 4000.1 is currently being updated and will be available soon.

A report from the Federal Housing Finance Agency's Office of the Inspector General found that the FHFA isn't doing enough to stop appraisal bias, HousingWire reported Dec. 23. The report suggested changes the FHFA should make, including alerting state regulators and licensing authorities when cases of appraisal bias are discovered and when complaints are filed about appraisals. # Housing Insights: Financial Benefits Motivated Homebuying During the Pandemic, More So Than Space or Location Preferences

Single-family housing was an unintended beneficiary of the pandemic and its associated policy response. During the pandemic, mortgage rates reached historically low levels, with the average 30-year fixed mortgage rate hovering around 3% though the end of 2021. Despite a low inventory-to-sales ratio during this time period by historical standards, as well as rising home prices, both home sales and purchase mortgage originations reached record highs in 2021. Anecdotal and analytical evidence suggest that the pandemic prompted people to move from smaller housing units in high-density city centers to larger homes in lower-density areas; and this was particularly true of firsttime homebuyers. Our researchers studied this phenomenon, and our survey findings illustrate the primacy of financial considerations over the benefits of physical space and location in influencing homebuying behavior

CRE Distress Market Unlikely to Materialize in 2023: Analysts
