### **Appraisal Standards Board Adopts New Edition of USPAP**

New edition will be effective January 1, 2024

On May 5, the Appraisal Standards Board voted to adopt the Fifth Exposure Draft of proposed changes to the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice



(USPAP). The new edition will be available this fall and will become effective on January 1, 2024. Unlike previous editions, it will not have an end date.

"Conducting this comprehensive review and revision of the Ethics Rule will benefit the profession and the public," said Appraisal Standards Board Chair Michelle Czekalski Bradley. "The Board was pleased by the results of this process and feels that this new edition of USPAP will be an asset to appraisers and the public alike who are seeking to gain a better understanding of an appraiser's ethical obligations and requirements under fair housing laws and regulations. Bias and discrimination have never been permitted by our standards, and now that is clear to all who read them."

All exposure drafts are developed by the Appraisal Standards Board and released for public comment. Successive exposure drafts are updated and released based on public comments on previous drafts.

REMINDER: The 2020-2021 USPAP is effective until December 31, 2023.

## FHFA REQUESTS INPUT ON THE ENTERPRISES' SINGLE-FAMILY PRICING FRAMEWORK

On May 15, the Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) issued a Request for Input (RFI) on Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac's (the Enterprises) single-family pricing framework. The RFI solicits public feedback on the goals and policy priorities that FHFA should pursue in its oversight of the pricing framework.

FHFA also seeks input on the process for setting the Enterprises' single-family upfront guarantee fees, including whether it is appropriate to continue to link upfront guarantee fees to the Enterprise Regulatory Capital Framework (ERCF), which was established in 2020, and has a significant impact on the risk-based pricing component of the Enterprises' guarantee fees.

"Through this RFI, FHFA seeks input on how to ensure the pricing framework adequately protects the Enterprises and taxpayers against potential future losses, supports affordable, sustainable housing and first-time homebuyers, and fosters liquidity in the secondary mortgage market," said Director Sandra L. Thompson. "We are committed to being transparent and to considering views from a diverse set of stakeholders and market participants."

Guarantee fees are intended to cover the Enterprises' administrative costs, expected credit losses, and cost of capital associated with guaranteeing securities backed by single-family mortgage loans. In 2022, the Enterprises began using the ERCF for measuring the profitability of new mortgage acquisitions, among other purposes, and FHFA began taking a series of steps to update the Enterprises' single-family guarantee fee pricing framework to better align the pricing and capital frameworks. The updates are intended to increase support for creditworthy borrowers

limited by income or by wealth, while ensuring a level playing field for small and large sellers, fostering capital accumulation, and achieving commercially reasonable returns on capital.

FHFA invites interested parties to provide written input, feedback, and information on all aspects of this RFI by August 14, 2023. 

### **Noeline Fuller Reg. VI Scholarship**

Noeline M. Fuller, MAI, SRA, was a member of the Appraisal Institute and its predecessor, the American Institute of Real Estate Appraisers. She displayed an unyielding commitment to service both at the Chapter and Regional level.



Noeline M. Fuller passed away in the summer of 2008. In her memory, Region VI created a scholarship to encourage more women and minority appraisers to actively pursue the Appraisal Institute designations.

#### THE SCHOLARSHIP PROCESS:

Region VI Chapters' candidates and practicing affiliates taking licensing courses or designation courses in good standing with the Appraisal Institute can apply for this scholarship by submitting the scholarship application, a written request summarizing professional goals and experience, involvement with the Appraisal Institute or their local AI chapter, commitment to achieving an Appraisal Institute designation, and letter of recommendation (preferably Region VI Committee Member, Chapter Board member or Advisor). A specific Qualifying or Designation Ed. Course must be included on the app with the dates to be considered for a scholarship.

**DEADLINE to SUBMIT APPLICATION:** June 30, 5 p.m. **SELECTION:** Selected applicants' application will be reviewed within one week of application deadline and recipient will be chosen shortly thereafter. Scholarship will be valid for one year from issue date.

### Al Letter to FHFA Critical of Value Acceptance Program

The Appraisal Institute on April 13 sent a letter to Federal Housing Finance Agency Director Sandra Thompson that was critical of Fannie Mae's "value acceptance" program. Al expressed its concerns about the program's potential effect on the valuation profession.

Specifically, Al said it was concerned that the value acceptance program is creating an alternative workforce of property data collectors that may negatively affect aspiring appraisers' ability to enter the valuation profession.

Currently, appraiser trainees are allowed to perform this work, but only under a supervisory appraiser-trainee relationship so that state regulatory officials can track and log it. Any experience earned outside of a supervisory appraiser process would therefore require a change to the Real Property Appraiser Qualifications Criteria and an overhaul of the logging of experience and oversight process. Al stated that, "We believe the current policies around property data collectors are at cross purposes relative to bringing new and diverse appraisers into the profession." Al is partnering with Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac on the Appraiser Diversity Initiative.

Additionally, AI raised concerns about messaging around value acceptance. When Fannie Mae announced the program, it stated that appraisals will no longer be the "default requirement." AI explained that increased use of value acceptance combined with hybrid or desktop appraisals could lead "reasonable people [to] conclude that attempts may be made to minimize the scope of services of appraisers. This has profound potential impacts on safety and soundness of the mortgage market, particularly considering the significant market and economic headwinds of the day." ### **More From Fannie Mae**

On March 1, 2023, we made a number of updates to the *Selling Guide*, including introducing value acceptance + property data, hybrid appraisals, and completion alternatives. In this update, we also provided additional details for appraisal report interior photograph requirements for the main living areas of the property to include the living room, family room, dining room, all bedrooms, and all finished and unfinished areas of the basement.

Appraisers may already be complying with these photograph requirements for the main living areas, and we encourage compliance immediately if not already doing so. However, we will require the full complement of main living area photographs for appraisals in loan applications dated on or after Sept. 1, 2023. See Selling Guide, B4-1.2-01, Appraisal Report Forms and Exhibits for the complete list of appraisal exhibits and photograph requirements.

The Appraisal Foundation's Board of Trustees awarded the Pathway to Success Grant to the Appraisal Institute to assist with the development of the PAREA program. The



Pathway to Success Conditional Grant is designed to open up the appraisal profession to a new generation of appraisers and stipulates that participant priority be given to veterans, minorities and those in designated rural areas. "This program will create many opportunities for aspiring appraisers who might not currently have a pathway into the profession."

"The introduction of this program to the marketplace opens a new pathway for aspiring appraisers, and we look forward to welcoming PAREA participants to the appraisal profession."

### Appraisal Inst. Seeks Nominations for Annual Awards; Due July 31

The Appraisal Institute announced May 3 that it is accepting nominations for its J. Scott Robinson Lifetime Achievement, Outstanding Service Award, William S. Harps DEI Award and Women's Initiative SPOTLIGHT Award, four ways that AI recognizes some of its brightest and most deserving professionals.

Nominations for all four awards are due July 31. The awards will be announced at Al's Joint Region and Chapter Leadership Program meetings in October in Louisville, Kentucky.

The J. Scott Robinson Lifetime Achievement is presented to an Al Professional who best demonstrates high ethical standards; contributed to the Appraisal Institute at the chapter, regional, national and/or international level(s); provided service to his or her community; and contributed to the appraisal profession. A minimum of 20 years of service is recommended to be eligible for this award.

The **Outstanding Service Award** is presented to an Al Professional who has contributed ideas, service hours and dedication to ensure a specific program or effort is implemented at either the chapter, region, national and/or international level(s). This Al Professional must be instrumental to the success of the program or effort, which also must be far enough along to measure and provide proof of success. Additionally, the program or effort must be beneficial to chapters, regions, national, international, designated members, candidates, affiliates, practicing affiliates and/or the profession.

The William S. Harps DEI Award is an annual honor that was established this year to recognize an AI Professional who exemplifies the value of diversity, equity and inclusion within the valuation profession and has contributed to making the profession reflective of all the communities we serve. William S. Harps, MAI, was the first African American to earn the MAI designation (1960), a past president of



American Institute of Real Estate Appraisers (1981) and a leader in breaking racial barriers in the appraisal profession.

The Women's Initiative SPOTLIGHT Award recognizes an AI Professional who has made an important contribution to fostering the growth of women in the valuation profession. All AI professionals are eligible for the Women's Initiative SPOTLIGHT Award.

HUD Gives \$54M to Groups in 42 States to Fight Appraisal Bias, Housing Discrimination

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development on March 21 awarded \$54 million to 182 fair housing groups in 42 states. Through HUD's Fair Housing Initiatives program, more than \$28 million will be allocated to address violations of the Fair Housing Act and to end discrimination in housing, including combatting appraisal bias.
