

Bartelt to be Awarded Olasin Honor

The George Olasin award is given to a member of the Southern New Jersey Chapter of the Appraisal Institute who has given years of dedicated service to the chapter and exhibited a high standard of ethics and professionalism in their appraisal practice. This award is named after George Olasin, 1962 Chapter President, who passed away in February 2011.

The George Olasin award for 2023 is being awarded to Steven Bartelt, MAI, SRA, AI-GRS. This prestigious honor will be recognized at the December 11th installation event, where he will be named as the award recipient by 2024 National Appraisal Institute President Sandy Adomatis, SRA.

Steven W Bartelt, MAI, SRA, AI-GRS, has been a full time practicing real estate appraiser since 1982. Steve was awarded the MAI designation by Allen G Black, MAI, on behalf of the Southern NJ Chapter of the Appraisal Institute in May of 1993. He also earned the SRA in 1988 and the AI-GRS in 2017. He became a State Certified General Real Estate Appraiser in 1994.

Steve received a bachelor's degree in biology from Washington & Jefferson College, Washington, Pennsylvania in May of 1978. He received a master's degree from Rowan University in 1988 in Environmental Science.

His early career was spent working with his father, E Wayne Bartelt whose office was in Haddon Township.

Since 1987 Steve has operated an appraisal office in Washington Township, New Jersey. Steve has an active practice and works primarily in the fields of eminent domain, wetlands, Pinelands, easements and partial interest. Although he has worked in most of the New Jersey counties, he enjoys the southern part of the state the most.

Unusual assignments have included the remnants of a bridge foundation in the Delaware River, a landlocked orchard, historic structures in Camden, and an island.

Steve is past President of the Southern New Jersey Chapter of the Appraisal Institute having served in 1994 and has served in various officer and director positions of the Southern New Jersey Chapter of the Appraisal Institute.

He taught classes locally and nationally for the Appraisal Institute and later became an Adjunct Professor of Biology at Rowan University. Steve resides in Sewell, Gloucester County, with his wife Judi. He has three children, two of whom live in Gloucester County. The third lives near Seattle. He has 11 grandchildren. 

ASC Holds Third Hearing on Appraiser Bias

The Appraisal Subcommittee on Nov. 1 hosted its third public hearing on appraisal bias, focusing on the residential valuation process (how appraisals are developed and reviewed), the procedures for reconsiderations of value and the process for completing rural appraisals. The ASC's intention with these hearings is to gather information and establish context to help its efforts to ensure fair appraisals for everyone. > FULL STORY

Seminars Presented on Zoom

On October 11, the chapter held 2 seminars on Zoom, with a combined attendance of almost 50 real estate appraisers. Both seminars were instructed by Susanne Curran, MAI, AI-GRS. New Jersey Appraiser Law & Regulations was 2 CE hours; this course is required by NJ regulations every two years. Students learned about the law itself, the regulations that



pertain to the law including specific areas noted in the regulation. All licensed and certified real estate appraisers shall be required to complete a two hour course on New Jersey law and rules governing the practice of real estate appraising. Focus on USPAP: Errors, Record Keeping, Review was developed by the instructor. The focused on spotlighting common

errors, record keeping and review work through the boundaries of USPAP.

Speaking of USPAP, the chapter will offer <u>7-Hour</u> National USPAP Continuing Education Course on Friday, December 8, on Zoom. This required 7-hour continuing education course, copyrighted by The Appraisal Foundation, focuses on USPAP requirements for ethical behavior and competent performance by appraisers. New case studies and tools are provided to help you learn how to better navigate USPAP in order to solve problems in your daily appraisal practice, and a USPAP Reference Manual is included with the course handbook. The topic of bias and appraisal practice will be covered using Advisory Opinion 16 showing how an appraiser can comply with USPAP as it relates to fair housing laws. The course will help you gain competency in USPAP, and it will help those subject to state licensing or certification and continuing education requirements imposed by professional organizations, client groups, or employers gain competency as well. NOTE. Appraisers must successfully complete the 7-Hour National USPAP Continuing Education Course every 2 years to meet the USPAP continuing education requirement. If you want hardcopy you have to select that option; there will be an extra fee. This material is required for the course, but it is not the USPAP Manual, it is the student handbook for the class. Al Board of Directors Approves Plan to Promote Designations

The Appraisal Institute Board of Directors during its Nov. 9-10 meeting approved an organization brand promotion and awareness plan in which all duespaying Designated Members will have the opportunity to receive a new designation emblem pin or charm that reflects the Al brand redesign. The new pins and charms incorporate the Al brand redesign that emphasizes the organization's mission and values — to empower valuation professionals through community, credentialing, education, body of knowledge, ethical standards, dedication to excellence, professionalism, ethics and integrity, commitment to leadership and innovation, and devotion to an inclusive and welcoming community.

Instructions for obtaining the pin or charm will be provided to Designated Members in the near future.

The Board also authorized the creation of a marketing and awareness campaign that will highlight the value of all Appraisal Institute designations with an emphasis on the SRA designation & the contributions and needs of residential appraisers. Special emphasis will be given to direct marketing and engagement of key users of appraisal services to promote the benefits of hiring AI Designated Members.

In other actions, consideration of the 45-Day Notice that was distributed to Al Professionals on Sept. 25 was deferred to the first regular 2024 Board meeting, which will take place Feb. 22-23.
